New Website on all things TROUT in Tennessee up and running

Whether you're looking for current information on where in Tennessee the fishing is hot or just want to know how to tie a pheasant tail nymph, there's a new site on the web that's worth checking out. It's <u>http://flyfishingtennessee.com</u> and it's chocked full of light angling lore and trophy trout tales as well as organizational updates and news on upcoming events across the state. Kris Mauer, fishing manager at Orvis, Sevierville, was instrumental in gathering information for the site and helps keep it up to date. One of the most useful information categories, I believe, is the information on Tennessee trout streams which is categorized under Tailwaters, Smoky Mountains and TN Trout Streams. He has also dedicated a page to LRCTU and our activities that will be updated on a regular basis. You can join the site by providing your email address and receive notices as the site is updated if you desire. Kris said the site is currently getting about 5000 visitors a month and that number has been growing by about 500 per month. Check it out!

Fishing Report: Winter's Thaw Brings Anglers Out

A few days of warm weather here and there and now a full week of 50 degree plus days have started to stoke the fishing fires amongst us. Byron Begley at Little River Outfitters reports that Little River is running a little lower than normal and a little cooler, 43 degrees on the morning of Feb. 17, but signs of a few hatching Quill Gordans expected warmer weather trends point to better days ahead. One angler reported that of a dozen trout landed, fishing with a dry and a dropper, two were caught on the dry.

Meanwhile, favorable weekend water releases and warmer weather have made tailwaters, such as the Clinch, a big attraction. On a recent Sunday, at Millers Island, I counted no less than 35 anglers stacked in on both sides of the Island. If you could find a spot that hadn't been stepped on, the ticket that day was 7 feet of 5x tippet and black sz. 16-18 zebra midges.
