She's been the park Entomologist at Great Smoky Mountains National Park since 1997 where her primary responsibilities include long-term monitoring of aquatic macroinvertebrates, and works with park-partner Discover Life in America (DLIA) on the All Taxa Biodiversity Inventory (ATBI), in an effort to identify all species in the park. She also helps implement the synchronous firefly event each year, and works on numerous other projects such as pollinator and monarch butterfly conservation.

Bead: 3mm slotted silver tungsten Wire: Worm - .015 lead-free wire. Sexy - .020 lead-free wire **Thread**: Worm - Danville 6/0 in Olive. Sexy - UTC 70 in fluorescent orange **Pearl Tinsel**: Sexy - Sulky Sliver Metallic in opalescent (for example) **Dubbing**: Natural hare's ear
