Steve Darnell, Dave Ostermier, Jim and Maggie Jeswald went with Ernie and I to the Buffalo Springs Hatchery September 26 to pick up eggs for the fall season. Since the Hatchery is currently short staffed, we assisted the biologists in counting out the 200 eggs for each of the schools. Pictures included show one of the biologists counting eggs which were then weighed. Once we had a weight for one batch, the rest were easy to scoop. The Hatchery had received well over 200,000 eggs that day and had reserved some for us. There were quite a few left after each of the 10 batches was put together so we divided up most of the leftovers.
